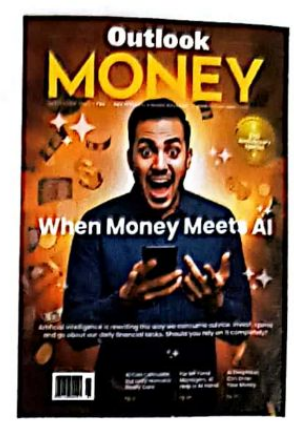
AI Made Simple
