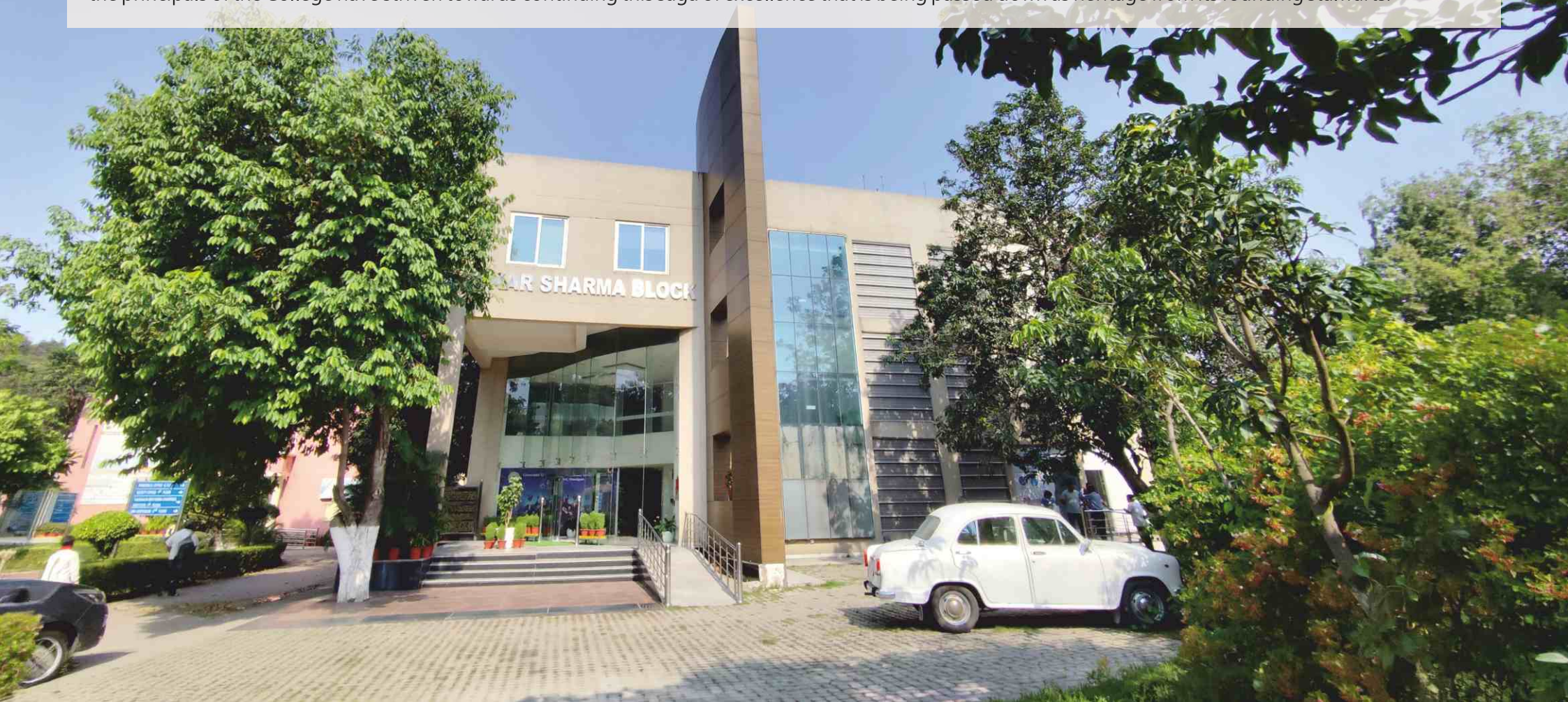

These research centres have been proactive in the exchange of ideas for the promotion of research through exposure to contemporary topics and events by regularly organising various expert talks, national seminars and workshops for the students.

## **DIGITAL CAMPUS**

The College has signed an MoU with Tata Consultancy Services, which enables complete automation of all administrative and academic activities. There are two product solutions described within this contract:

- a) Campus Management System (CMS) enables the College to carry out various administrative activities. Every student is registered online which allows them to access his/her timetable, attendance, leave, fee, grades, fines and documentation regarding library and hostel facility through this ERP solution.
- b) Learning Exchange Module helps faculty and students to share their e-content, assignments, PPT presentations, course schedule and other examination details.



## INFRASTRUCTURE

Set across an expansive 16.5-acre campus, the college is distinguished by thoughtfully landscaped grounds, airy classrooms, state-of-the-art laboratories, and contemporary facilities that together foster a vibrant, enriching, and holistic academic milieu.

The College features fully automated generators, a three-lakh-litre underground water reservoir, an on-campus Central Bank of India ATM, and a fully equipped ambulance. Its 500-kW solar power plant offsets nearly 730 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> annually; 930 Mono Perc panels (540 Wp each) generate approximately 2200–2250 units of electricity per day, subject to weather conditions.

The campus is secured by 166 IP-based high-definition CCTV cameras.


The centrally air-conditioned Administrative Block, developed under Building

Management Automation System (BMAS), houses the Principal's, Registrar's, and administrative offices, along with a conference hall, management offices, the Kaushaliya Devi Verma Charitable Institute, guest rooms, and a state-of-the-art mini auditorium. The basement includes offices for NSS, Placement, and Publication, the B.Voc Kaushal Kendra, Statistical Cell, UGC Grants Cell, the Company Secretary's office, a conference room, and record rooms.

The College offers spacious classrooms, including smart rooms, lecture theatres, seminar halls, and laboratories, along with a dark room, a succulent terrace garden, a herbal garden, and aquariums. Its ultra-modern Main Auditorium is fully automated, centrally air-conditioned, touch-screen operated, and seats up to 1000 persons.

Upkar Krishan Sharma Open Air Theatre, established under the PM-USHA scheme within the campus, stands as a vibrant symbol of holistic education.

Pt. Mohan Lal (Commerce) Block, Prof. Roshan Lal Verma (Arts) Block, Science Block, a separate PG Block, Faculty Interaction Room, Girls' Common Room, Sports Ground, Boys' Hostel, Girls' Hostel, Recreation Hall, Gymnasium, and Principal's lodge form an integral part of the well-planned campus. A new teaching Block, Block-C, comprising 10 new classrooms, 12 air-conditioned faculty cabins, 8 washrooms for girls, and an elevator for differently-abled persons/persons with disability, has been constructed. The campus has well-maintained washroom facilities. It is fully inclusive of differently-abled persons/persons with disability, featuring accessible amenities and ramps leading to all teaching blocks and the library.



The Television and Radio Studio-cum-Multimedia Lab, Central Instrumentation Facility Lab, Research Lab for Biotechnology and Fashion Designing Lab provide students with hands-on experience. The Department of Computer Science and Applications is equipped with smart classrooms, a dedicated server room, and eight well-equipped laboratories, including a hardware laboratory for the B.Voc. Hardware & Networking programme. The College is interconnected through a gigabit network supported by a fiber-optic backbone, enabling data transfer rates in GBPS and linking eight campus buildings and hostels to the central server. Wi-Fi internet access is available across the campus as well as in both hostels. Furthermore, Wi-Fi access points have been installed across the College campus to enhance connectivity.

## LIBRARY

The Library Resource Centre is equipped with a state-of-the-art RFID system integrated with TCS iON and Libsys KSmart, ensuring efficient circulation, security, and user convenience. It houses over 75,228 books, 3,561 CDs/DVDs, 102 journals and magazines, and 23 newspapers. Its digital collection provides access to 15 lakh+ e-books via EBSCO, NDLI, McGraw Hill, and Perlego, along with 5,200+ e-periodicals through ProQuest. It also subscribes to the CMIE Prowess database, offering detailed data on 1,13,556+ companies.

The Centralised Research Facility-cum-Digital Library houses 25 advanced systems (15 for students, 10 for staff) enabling access to e-resources and the CMIE Prowess database. It includes JAWS screen-reading software for visually impaired users and subscribes to DrillBit plagiarism detection and QuillBot paraphrasing tools. The Knimbus eLibrary (off-campus access to e-resources) enables you to access e-resources anytime, anywhere. To enhance the visibility and impact of the college and its faculty, the library has initiated the integration of faculty profiles into the IRINS (<https://ggdsd.irins.org>) and Vidwan databases. Information Services like OPAC (Online Public Access



Catalogue), Reprographic Service, ILL (Inter Library Loan), Internet Surfing, Current Content Alert, SMS Alert Services, Previous Year PU Question Papers Alert, Employment News and Books of the Month are provided to the users of the library.

A library blog (<https://libraryggdsd.blogspot.com>) provides the latest updates regarding library collections and activities. Sh. Upkar Krishan Sharma Digital Repository is home to a wide range of materials, including Pt. Mohan Lal's Handwritten Diaries, the college's annual reports, prospectus, e-newsletters, newspaper clippings, and other electronic content.

National Digital Library of India Club (NDLI Club) of GGSD College disseminates NDLI resources amongst the students and faculty members of the college through workshops sensitization programmes. This has been established under the aegis of Ministry of Education (MOE), Government of India. Readers Club of the library holds different activities throughout the year to promote the habit of quality reading among students.

## EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

## Punishable Ingredients of Ragging

Abetment to ragging; Criminal conspiracy to rag; Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging; Public nuisance created during ragging; Violation of decency and morals through ragging; Injury to body; causing hurt or grievous hurt; Wrongful restraint; Wrongful confinement; Use of criminal force; Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; Extortion; Criminal trespass; Offences against property; Criminal intimidation; Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim (s); Physical or psychological humiliation; All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging". #

## College Committee Against Sexual Harassment
